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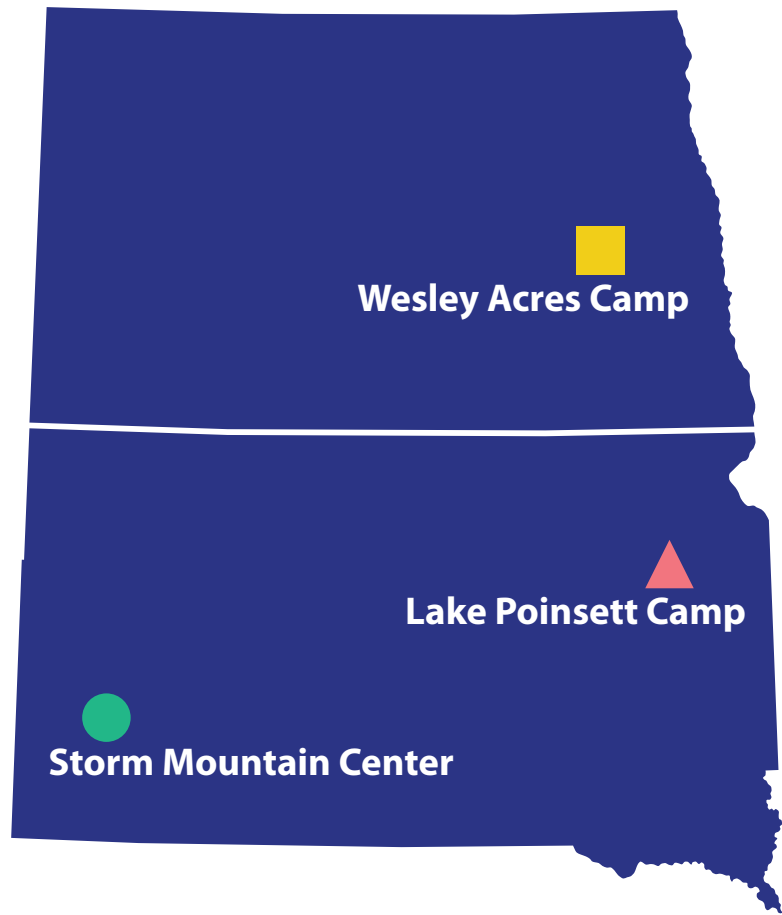
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Welcome!

CAMPER SAFETY IS TOP PRIORITY

Dakotas' camp staff regularly review every facet of camp programs and operations to ensure a safe and quality camp experience for all participants. All camps owned and leased by the Dakotas Annual Conference of The United Methodist church are accredited through the American Camp Association, the national accrediting body for camping programs. To earn accreditation, camps must comply with hundreds of health, safety, and program quality standards. Only one in five camps nationwide achieves this distinction.

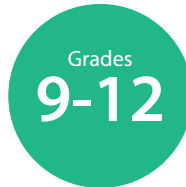

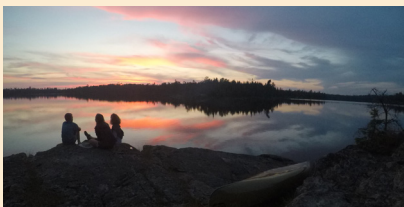

Frequently Asked Questions

WHO CAN ATTEND CAMP?

Everyone is welcome at camp! Our camps are open to all regardless of age, ancestry, color, disability or handicap, national origin, race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity (including gender expression), dietary restrictions or food service needs. Our camps do not tolerate discrimination, harassment, and bullying against any person for any reason.

HOW DO I PAY FOR CAMP?

We ask for a minimum deposit of \$100 at the time of registration. We accept Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express through our online registration system, and for mail or phone registrations. You may also mail in a check payment. If you are unable to pay in full at the time of registration, you can access your Campwise online account at any time to make payments (requires on-line registration.) We ask that you pay the full cost of camp, or have a payment plan confirmed, at least two weeks before you arrive at camp. **Please do not bring payment to camp!**

IS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE?

Yes! The Dakotas Conference of The United Methodist Church believes that every child should have a Christian camping experience, and no camper will be turned away due to a personal lack of funds. We provide scholarship funds to campers who need them most, based on individual and family needs. Our hope is that the individual's local church, personal funds and other sources of support will combine with campership support to cover the registration cost for one Dakotas United Methodist camping event per year. To apply, first enroll in the camp of your choice. Then complete our easy campership application in the **Forms section** of our website. HOW CAN I FIND ANOTHER CAMPER TO CARPOOL WITH?

WHAT IS YOUR CANCELLATION POLICY?

WE MUST RECEIVE ALL CANCELLATIONS IN WRITING. Email us at info@dakcamps.org. Please see the following breakdown for applicable cancellation fees.

If cancellation occurs:

- More than 21 days before the start of camp, we will give a full refund.
- Between 15-20 days prior to the start of camp, we will give a full refund minus a \$50 processing fee.
- Between 8-14 days prior to the start of camp, we will give a full refund minus a \$100 processing fee.
- Less than 7 days prior to the start of camp, no refund will be issued.
- A no call/no show to camp will result in forfeit of all payments.

We will give a full refund in the event of a documented illness or family emergency. Please call the camping office at (855) 622-1973 (toll free) with any questions.

HOW DO I FIND OUT WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP, WHAT TIME TO ARRIVE, AND WHEN TO CHECK OUT?

If you registered by mail or phone, you will receive a confirmation packet within two weeks that will include: a camp welcome letter, all required forms, a map to camp, and a Dakotas-Minnesota Area Parent's & Camper's Handbook.

The camp welcome letter will list: what each camper should bring to camp, what they should NOT bring to camp, what to expect at camp, and instructions about times for check-in and check-out.

If you registered online, all required forms are located under the **Online Forms** tab in your Campwise online registration "dashboard." You will find the camp welcome letter, map, and Dakotas-Minnesota Area Parent's & Camper's Handbook under the **Download Forms** tab.

HOW DO I REGISTER MY CHILD WITH SPECIAL NEEDS?

Fill out the "Camper's Needs" information section on the registration form. Provide additional comments where indicated. A Dakotas United Methodist Camps representative will contact you regarding your camper's needs and integration services. Personal care attendants (PCA) are welcome to attend camp with their camper. There is no cost for attending PCAs, but they must register for camp.

Registration Tips

ONLINE REGISTRATION

When registering online for camp for the first time, please plan for the process to take about 15-20 minutes to complete. If you have registered online before, be sure to use the same login information. If you have forgotten your login or password, please contact our office, and we will be happy to help. Remember, registering online is the fastest and best way to guarantee your spot! Register at www.dakcamps.org.

We suggest you gather all the items needed before you start. Dakotas United Methodist Camps wants to make sure we have the most current information to keep campers safe and secure during their time with us. You will be able to search through available camps once you enter all required information.

After completing your online registration, you will receive an automated confirmation email. If you do not receive an email directly after you register your camper for camp, your registration is not processed. Review your registration for missing information then resubmit. If you are still having trouble, call the camp office.

A \$100 deposit is required with each camp registration unless otherwise indicated. The balance is due in full two weeks prior to the start of camp. For financial assistance, please complete the campership application located in the **Forms section** of our website, or check the campership application request on your paper registration form.

REQUIRED FORMS

The following forms are required and must be completed by all campers: **Camper Health History and Authorization Form, Release of Liability Waiver and Public Relations Release**, and, if needed, a **Medications Form**.

For campers who register online, please fill out these forms under the **Online Forms** tab of your registration dashboard. If you would prefer to complete these forms by hand, you may choose to download and print them from the **Download Forms** tab. **Forms completed online do not need to be printed and brought to camp.** If not filled out online, forms **MUST** be printed, filled out, and brought to camp.

For campers who register by mail or phone, our office will send all of the required forms to the camper by e-mail or U.S. postal mail. Please let us know your preference. Bring completed forms to camp check-in.

BE A SHEPHERD

A shepherd is a person who helps to ensure our youngest campers have a great camp experience!

Shepherds should plan to be responsible for up to five campers, participate in all camp activities, supervise cabin time, and assist staff and deans as needed.

Whenever possible, shepherds will be housed in cabins with the child/children they are bringing to camp. However, when moms come with sons and dads with daughters, or if additional staff of the same gender is needed to meet required supervision ratios, shepherds may be placed in sleeping rooms away from their own child/children.

All adults working with campers (including shepherds) must complete an annual background check. All shepherds must register at least seven days prior to the beginning of camp to allow time for the background check to be completed.

Register early! There are a maximum number of shepherds for each camp. **The fee for shepherds is \$90.00.**
